Frequently Asked Questions

Who can receive palliative care?

 Anyone with a serious or potentially lifelimiting illness, regardless of the stage of that illness.

What is the difference between hospice and palliative care?

Palliative care is not the same as hospice care.
Hospice care is meant for people in the final
months of life. Palliative care, on the other
hand, is available to you at any time during your
illness. Unlike hospice, you can also receive
palliative care at the same time as curative
treatments.

Will insurance cover palliative care?

 Most insurance plans, including Medicare and Medicaid, cover palliative care services. It is handled like other medical services, such as oncology or cardiology.

How do I start the process?

Getting palliative care is easy. Just ask for it.
You may already have been referred to Keystone
Medical Services' palliative care team,, but
if not, just ask your doctor for a referral. We
work together with your primary physician, so
you will not have to give up your own doctor.


What is Palliative Care?

Palliative care:

- Is the medical specialty focused on relief of the pain and other symptoms of serious, life-threatening illness
- Improves quality of life for patients and their families
- Is appropriate at any point in an illness
- Can be provided at the same time as curative treatment
